Te Wiki o te Reo Māori - Māori Language Week

Tena koutou katoa. Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa. Warm greetings to you all.

It's hard to believe that we are heading towards the end of the term. If you have been following our Facebook page you will see that there has been a lot happening at Belfast School in the last few weeks.

Many thanks to all the parents and whānau who have supported our trips and events. Without your help we would be limited in providing our students with the extra opportunities that trips and events outside school offer.

Coming up next week are the **Koru Games** and we are very fortunate to have parents working as coaches and supporters for the teams. The Koru Games are an annual event organised by the Selwyn Sports Trust for Year 7 & 8 children attending South Island Schools. The Koru Games begin with an opening ceremony, and similar to the Olympic Games, there is a "*Fair Play Promise*" which sets out the expectations for players, teachers, coaches, parents and supporters. A copy of the *Fair Play Promise* has been posted on our Facebook page. We will have three teams participating in the competition - Netball, Football and Touch. We wish the teams good luck and win or lose we know they will represent our school proudly and demonstrate a positive attitude.

During **Te Wiki o te Māori - Māori Language Week** there have been a number of activities for students to participate in. Senior students have led the school karakia each morning using the Office intercom, **Waiata Wednesday** involved a competition between classes for the best waiata singing, and students were able to participate in different activities during break times, such as games and listening to stories.

Learning to speak a second language has many benefits including improving our memory and concentration. It is like giving our brain a good workout. Children learn a second language much faster than adults. Here is a phrase you might like to try: Wehi nā – Oh my goodness!

We have recently made a change to where the children can play during break times. Children can now choose to play anywhere in the grounds with children from other year groups. The only restricted areas are the skate park and Sheldon playground which are limited to older children.



The changes have given children access to all the different play structures and courts along with the opportunity to play and interact with their older and younger friends. The students are enjoying the change and we have seen some lovely moments with older students playing with younger children.

School Uniform / Sunhats



With the weather starting to warm up, please note that Summer uniform is only to be worn in Terms 1 and 4. When the children start back at school for Term 4 on Monday, 16 October they will need to bring and wear a navy blue sunhat when they are outside at school each day.

Safety Around Rail Tracks:
